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
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

"These are the times that try men's souls."

It's a phrase that could well describe our nation today as we prepare to enter the new millennium. full of skepticism, riddled with uncertainty, crippled by moral decay. But it was penned in December 1776 by the radical free thinker Thomas Paine, considered by many to be the author of the American Revolution.

John Adams said that "Without the pen of Paine, the sword of Washington would have been wielded in vain."

Paine's pamphlet, "Common Sense," was the colonies' first runaway bestseller, with about 100,000 copies distributed. It was this work

edited and expanded version of Paine's first draft.

There is a movement within the American church that gained popuAmerican as apple pie, they believe, and the Declaration of Independence is an extension of biblical principles.

It is not.

That our early system of politics and law reflected biblical ideals only reflects how pervasive Christianity was in the culture of the 1700s. Sure, there were numerous genuine Christians who participated in the formulation of the United States.

It's just that Jefferson and Paine weren't among them.

A subtle beresy had crept into American society in the mid-1700s: deism. Deism originated in England during the earlier part of the century. Its premise, stated simply, is that

from leaving the principles in the Declaration of Independence, in the Golden Rule, in the Ten Commandments, and in the Sermon on the Mount."


It will come from losing sight of the fact that "Righteousness exalteth a nation, but that sin is a reproach to any people."
